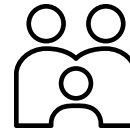
## REQUIRED COMMITMENTS

1. Attend NdCAD's Parent Power (Adult) & Sankofa (children k-8) and complete Self-Determinatinizing Plan
2. Complete Wealth & Asset Building Workshops (Adults & Youth)
3. Make Deposits into Invest-in-your-future accounts up to \$50 per month
4. Complete My Pathway Plan with Ramsey County
5. Participate in 6 month Fellowship Journey
