

# KID CITY Year 2 Evaluation:

## *Community event survey data tables*

KID CITY is a partnership between the City of Maplewood and Z Puppets Rosenschnoz that empowers communities through the power of playfulness and public art across age, class and culture, putting youth at the forefront of creative community revitalization. For the KID CITY evaluation, Wilder Research developed the “KID CITY Journal” survey to track which activities families participated in at the Maplewood Laugh-In as well as collect family demographic information. We also developed a stand-alone demographic survey to gather family demographic information at other KID CITY outreach events. We only made these surveys available at KID CITY-specific events, but not at events led by other organizations at which KID CITY activities took place. In total, the surveys were available at four events (the Maplewood Laugh-In and three other KID CITY outreach events). The KID CITY team observed greater diversity than is represented in these tables, which may be due to the difficulty of gathering demographic data through self-administered surveys at drop-in events like these (i.e., low response rates, and differential response rates among families from different demographic groups).
