# **Community Needs Assessment Data Book**

Prepared for the Community Action Partnership of Scott, Carver, & Dakota Counties

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### Introduction

The Community Action Partnership of Scott, Carver, Dakota Counties (SCD-CAP) is a private, locally run nonprofit with offices in Shakopee and Rosemount, dedicated to bringing together resources to reduce poverty. The CAP Agency works in five key areas of focus, 1) Crisis Interventions, 2) Educational Services, 3) Food and Nutrition, 4) Safe and Stable Housing, and 5) Community Outreach. Programming and resources provided by SCD-CAP include housing services, such as transitional housing and homeless prevention programs, as well as tenant education, and assistance with utility costs and energy conservation. Case workers for SCD-CAP's programs help families strategize how to meet client transportation needs and financial needs through planning and budgeting. Health services are offered through SCD-CAP's early childhood programming where families can get assistance accessing dental care, medical assistance, mental health services, and help with prescriptions. To assist clients in achieving employment SCD-CAP offers help with resume writing, applying for jobs, and exploring higher education. To help meet the basic needs of clients, SCD-CAP operates a thrift shop and offers schools supplies, holiday gifts, and emergency service funds through their programming. SCD-CAP operates a food shelf among other food and nutrition-related programming. Additionally, child care services for families are provided through programs like Child Care Aware and Crisis Nursery.

SCD-CAP is required to conduct a community needs assessment every three years as a part of federal funding. In 2015, Wilder Research was contracted by SCD-CAP to conduct this assessment.

### Methods

Several data gathering approaches were used for this community needs assessment, including a participant survey, demographic data review, field scan, and analysis of existing research. The data from these sources was triangulated and synthesized to identify the key findings that are illustrated in the 2015 SCD-CAP community needs assessment summary report.

This methodology report and data book describes in detail how we conducted the 2015 SCD-CAP community needs assessment, and provides data tables for each of the survey questions that were asked of SCD-CAP participants. It should be used by SCD-CAP program staff and managers to better understand program participants and their needs, and by SCD-CAP leadership to target strategic program improvements to best meets the needs of low-income people in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties.

#### **SCD-CAP** participant survey

Wilder Research conducted a survey of participants who are currently receiving services from SCD-CAP.

#### Survey instrument design

The survey instrument was designed by Wilder Research with input from SCD-CAP. The six-page survey included 26 questions about the primary needs of participants and participants' households. Additionally, the survey asked about participants' current use and need of SCD-CAP's social service programs, their satisfaction with these services, as well as challenges related to meeting their and their family's basic needs. See the Appendix for the survey instrument.

#### Participant selection

Mailed invitations were sent to a random sample of 1,976 SCD-CAP program participants, stratified by program to adequately represent programs with smaller numbers of participants. However, participants in programs that serve teen moms, young adults, and youth were specifically asked to complete the survey to ensure that the voices of young people were captured. SCD-CAP programs serving young people include Housing, Healthy Families, Early Head Start, and New Beginnings. Although New Beginnings is not one of SCD-CAP's internal programs, they have been partnering with SCD-CAP for over 20 years. A total of 693 SCD-CAP participants completed the representative mailed survey, for a 35 percent response rate. Respondents were often participants of one or more of SCD-CAP programs. SCD-CAP staff worked to recruit participants to complete the web survey by, 1) encouraging participations from those who attended a resource fair event called Community Connect, 2) inviting walk-in clients and, 3) inviting clients who are involved in day-to-day programming (e.g. Head Start staff inviting a client to participate during a



Although primarily a web survey, the survey was also made available to other low-income residents of Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties who were not SCD-CAP program participants via a web survey. Sixty-one individuals (who may or may not be SCD-CAP participants) started the opt-in web survey and of those 61, a total of 24 completed it. SCD-CAP partners with New Beginnings, Housing, Healthy Families, and Early Head Start. All of these programs work with teen moms, youth, or young adults. SCD-CAP asked participants in these programs, specifically New Beginnings, to complete the survey. New Beginnings in not one of SCD-CAP's internal programs but has been a partner for over 20 years.

As an incentive to complete the survey, respondents were offered the opportunity to enter a drawing for one of five \$100 VISA gift cards at survey completion. The drawing was completed in October 2015.

#### Data cleaning and analysis

Wilder Research compiled and analyzed the survey. Data were cleaned prior to analysis to ensure that the Voxco Acuity4 web survey software properly collected respondents' surveys. Data were then analyzed using Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) to produce response frequencies as well as responses by respondent subgroups (Energy Assistance and Energy Conservation; Senior Dining and Chore; Housing; Head Start, Early Head Start, Child Care Aware, and Crisis Nursery; SNAP, Food Shelf, WIC, and Dakota Healthy Families).

For open-ended questions on the survey, code lists were developed for analysis of responses. These code lists were used to categorize open-ended responses for analysis in SPSS. Qualitative data collected from key informant interviews were analyzed using thematic codes. Each theme was given a count according to how many interviews included discussion of that theme.

#### Demographic overview

In addition to the survey data gathered for this study, SCD-CAP gathered and Wilder Research compiled information from the U.S. Census Bureau, Minnesota Compass (mncompass.org), and other sources in order to enhance understanding of SCD-CAP's service area (i.e., Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties). Data compiled from these sources outline some characteristics of residents of each county whose income level is classified as low-income. Additionally, these data provide some trend analysis in regards to the percentage of the population living in poverty in the three geographic areas. These data include:

- Overall poverty trends
- Age and gender
- Race/ethnicity, nativity, and language
- Employment, education, disability status, and transportation to work
- Crime rates and barriers associated with criminal backgrounds
- Housing

#### Field scan

Wilder Research conducted a field scan of organizations that are at the service of low-income residents of Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties. The field scan consisted of interviews with 29 organization leaders; Wilder Research asked about leaders' perceptions regarding the needs of low-income residents in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties and how organizations at the service of low-income residents in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties might work together for increased efficacy. See the Appendix for the key informant interview protocol.

Wilder Research and SCD-CAP together identified 117 organizations that provide services to low-income residents of Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties. From the list of 117 organizations, Wilder Research – with guidance from SCD-CAP – invited 39 organizations to participate in an interview. Of the 39 organizations invited, 29 agreed to an interview. Of the organizations identified the most common services were related to employment (16%), housing (15%), food (14%), health care (13%), and utilities (9%). Less than 5 organizations provide services related to transportation, alcohol abuse or chemical dependency, and financial services. Most of these organizations serve residents of the metro area, primarily in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties. Forty-seven identified organizations provide services for residents across the state. See the Appendix for a full list of the 117 organizations.

#### Study review

Lastly, Wilder Research conducted a study review to identify existing data regarding gaps in services for low-income populations and for specific subgroups in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties. When triangulated with the survey data, these additional data provide increased nuance regarding the greatest gaps in services for low-income people in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties. ### How to read the tables in this data book

For every table in this data book that displays data from the participant survey, results are displayed by subgroups of respondents based on:

- Program enrollment, including Energy Assistance and Energy Conservation; Senior Dining and Chore; Housing; Head Start, Early Head Start, Child Care Aware, and Crisis Nursery; SNAP, Food Shelf, WIC, and Dakota Healthy Families
  - for the purposes of data analysis, opt-in web survey respondent were separated from participant survey respondents; web survey respondents may or may not be receiving services from SCD-CAP
- Race/ethnicity, including white and non-white
- Language spoken at home, including English and other language
- Household type, including no children, single parent with 1+ children, and partnered parent with 1+ children
- Poverty status, including respondents at less than 100% of poverty, 100% to less than 125% poverty, 125% to 200% of poverty, and above 200% of poverty
- Geographic area, including Carver, Dakota, and Scott counties

The columns in each table correspond to the response options respondents were given on the survey. If a table presents a survey question with fixed response categories, each column indicates the percentage of respondents who gave that response to the question. The last column in each row of the table always presents the number of people related to the percentages in that row. Note that some questions apply only to certain types of respondents (e.g., those with a child age 12 or younger); in these cases, the total number of respondents includes only the respondents for whom the question was applicable.

Some table cells are filled with only a dash. This means that data were suppressed to protect confidentiality because fewer than 10 respondents answered a particular question.

Some questions were open-ended, such that respondents wrote their own answers. Responses from the participant surveys are combined for open-ended tables. Responses were grouped according to theme in order to reveal which trends are most notable for the most respondents. In some cases, respondents provided more than one answer; for this reason, the total number of responses listed in these tables does not reflect the number of

respondents, but rather number of answers for a question. The number of respondents can be seen in the title of each table ("N="). Where fewer than 10 respondents submitted an answer fitting a particular theme, that theme is grouped with other answers in an "Other" category. Twenty-two percent have not been able to get on a waiting list because it was closed. Forty-eight percent of those who left their last regular or permanent housing left because they couldn't afford rent or house payments. Sixty-nine percent of respondents said they have had difficulty getting or keeping housing because there was no housing they could afford.

**Employment:** Forty-three percent of those who left their last regular or permanent housing left because they lost their job or had their hours cut. Eighty-seven percent of respondents said they have had difficulty getting or keeping housing because of lack of job or income. Seventy-five percent said lack of job or income is the number one factor preventing them from getting housing now.

Seventy-two percent of respondents are not employed. Seventy-nine percent of those employed earn an hourly rate of between \$7.25-\$11.99.

For those not employed, the biggest barriers or problems to getting a job are transportation (51%), physical health (35%), and housing (21%).

### **Dakota County**

The total number of homeless people in Dakota County was 328 (178 minors and adults, 150 children with parents) in 2012.

For those who are on a waiting list for public housing, Section 8, or some other type of housing that offer financial assistance have been waiting a mean of 16 months. Thirty-six percent have not been able to get on a waiting list because it was closed. Forty-four percent of those you left their last regular or permanent housing left because they

couldn't afford rent or house payments. Fifty-four percent of respondents said they have had difficulty getting or keeping housing because there was no housing they could afford.

**Employment**: Twenty-four percent of those who left their last regular or permanent housing left because they lost their job or had their hours cut. This memo describes preliminary findings of the 2015 community needs assessment demographic overview. The majority of these findings are based on secondary data obtained from the 2010 US Census and the American Community Survey 2013 5-year estimates. Additionally, we accessed Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (via Minnesota Compass) for crime rate data. We also accessed Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development for job vacancy data.

The purpose of the demographic overview is to provide CAP-SCD decision-makers with some pertinent characteristics of low-income residents in Scott County, Carver County, and Dakota County. After consulting CAP-SCD, Wilder Research included five sections in this demographic overview (based on specific characteristics of low-income residents). These sections include::

- Overall poverty trends
- Age and gender
- Race/ethnicity, nativity, and language
- Employment, education, disability, transportation to work
- Crime rates
- Housing

## **Overall poverty trends**

Overall, the percentage of residents living in poverty in Dakota County in 2013 was higher than in Scott and Carver counties, with Carver County exhibiting the lowest poverty rate (9% in Dakota County compared to 7% in Scott County and 4% in Carver County). The percentage of residents in poverty increased in all three counties from 2000-2010 (from 3-5% in Scott County, 3-5% in Carver County, and 4-7% in Dakota County). Carver County was the only county to show a **decrease in the percentage of residents living in poverty from 2010-2013** (from 5% to 4%), while the percentage continued to increase in the other counties (from 5-7% in Scott County, and 7-9% in Dakota County). In all three counties the percentage of residents living in poverty was higher in 2013 than in 2000 (4% compared to 3% in Carver County, 4% compared to 9% in Dakota County, and 7% compared to 3% in Scott County).

## Age and gender

## Age

In Carver and Scott counties 6 percent of those under the age of 18 are in poverty, and 11 percent in Dakota County. Dakota County has more than 4 times the number of minors in poverty in Scott County, and more than 7 times the number in Carver County.

Additionally, a trend analysis showed that the changes in percentage of youth and children in poverty over time were more drastic than the population in poverty overall. This finding suggests that children and youth are more likely as compared to adults or older adults to fluctuate in and out of poverty over time.

Five percent of adults (18-64 years old) in Carver County, and 4 percent of adults in Scott and Dakota counties are living in poverty. When comparing percentage of men and women in this age group, the differences of 1 to 2 percent are in line with overall population differences

Older adults make up less than 15 percent of those in poverty in all geographic areas, with the largest percentage in Carver County (14% in Carver County, 9% in Scott County, and 7% in Dakota County). Additionally, poverty rates for older adults in Scott County and Carver County were 2 to 10 percentage points higher as compared to the population in poverty as a whole. In Dakota County, the poverty rate for older adults was 2 percentage points lower compared to the population in poverty as a whole.

#### Gender

Overall, women are overrepresented among those in poverty as compared to men in each geographic area (55-56% of the population in poverty is female, 44-45% is male). However, the overall population of each geographic area contains close to equal numbers of men and women (50% male and 50% female in Scott and Carver counties, and 49% male and 51% female in Dakota County).

In these counties, older women are more likely to be poor than older males (8-11-16% of females in poverty are older adults whereas 5-7-10% of males in poverty are older adults in Dakota, Scott and Carver counties, respectively). However, 36-41 percent of males in poverty are under the age of 18, compared to 27-32 percent of females in poverty who are under the age of 18.

## Race/ethnicity, nativity, and language

## Race/ethnicity

From 1999-2013, the general population (i.e., not just those in poverty) in each county experienced growth in the non-white populations; in 2013 in Scott County, Carver County, and Dakota County, there were higher percentages of black, Asian, and non-white Hispanic residents than in 1999. However, in 2013, the majority of residents in each geographic area was still white: 84 percent of residents in Scott County were white, 90 percent were white in Carver County, and 82 percent were white in Dakota County. The three biggest non-white populations in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties are Asian (6%, 3%, and 4% respectively), Hispanic (4%, 4%, and 6% respectively), and Black (3%, 1%, and 5% respectively).

In all three counties white residents make up at the majority of those in poverty. Of those in poverty in Carver County, 75 percent were white (compared to 89% of the population overall); 54 percent of residents in poverty in Dakota County were white (compared to 80 percent of the population overall); and 59 percent of residents in poverty were white in Scott County (compared to 83% of the overall population). The percentage of all whites living in each county that are in poverty is much lower than the percentage of other racial and ethnic groups in poverty (4% in Scott County and Carver County, and 5% in Dakota County).

Black residents in 2013 made up 1-5 percent of the total population in any geographic area; they made up 2-17 percent of those in poverty. Asian residents in 2013 made up 3-6 percent of the total population in any geographic area; they made up 1-8 percent of those in poverty. Non-white Hispanic residents in 2013 made up 4-6 percent of the total

population; they made up 15-19 percent of those in poverty. These findings indicate that residents of color experience poverty at higher rates than white residents in Scott, Carver, and Dakota counties.

In Carver County, white residents make up the largest proportion of those in poverty (75%), followed by Hispanic residents of any race (15%). Poverty by race/ethnicity in Dakota County is concentrated among white residents (54%), followed by Hispanic residents of any race (19%) and black residents (17%). In Scott County, the majority of resident in poverty are white (59%), followed by Hispanic residents of any race (18%) and black residents (10%).

## Nativity

Of residents in poverty, about four-fifths are native born in Carver County, Dakota County, and Scott County (81%, 80%, and 85%, respectively).

## Language

About three-quarters of residents in Carver County, Dakota County, and Scott County speak only English at home (75% in Carver County, 73% in Dakota County, 71% in Scott County). Just over 1 out of 10 residents in poverty (11-15%) speak Spanish. A small proportion of speak an Asian language in Dakota County and Scott County (4% and 6%, respectively). In Carver County, 11 percent speak an Indo-European language.

# Education, employment, disability status, and transportation to work

#### Education

About one-fifth of residents in poverty in Carver County (18%) and Dakota County (18%) and one-quarter (24%) of residents in poverty in Scott County possess less than a high school diploma or GED. Two-fifths of residents in poverty in Carver County and Scott County have high school diplomas and the same is true for one-third (34%) of residents in poverty in Dakota County. About one-third have an Associate's degree or have attended some college (33% in Carver County, 32% in Dakota County, 27% in Scott County), and 7-16 percent possess a bachelor's degree.

### **Employment**

One-third of residents in poverty (33%) in Carver County are employed compared to 40 and 41 percent in Dakota County and Scott County. Over half (54%) of Carver

County residents in poverty are not in the labor force compared with 41 percent in Dakota County and 45 percent in Scott County.

Of those who are in poverty and employed, less than 15 percent in any geographic area are employed full-time year-round (10% in Carver and Dakota County, and 11% in Scott County). A larger percentage of residents in poverty are employed for part of the year or part-time (38% in Carver County and 39% in Scott County). In Dakota County, a slightly higher percentage of those in poverty are employed for part of the year or part-time (44%). According to Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) data for the Twin-cities 7-county metro area, there were 49,281 vacant jobs in late 2014, 33 percent of which were part-time and 10 percent of which were seasonal or temporary. Slightly more than half of vacant jobs (56%) required one or more years of experience, 44 percent required some level of post-secondary education, and 31 percent required a specialized certificate or license.

## Disability status

Under one in five residents in poverty in Dakota County and Scott County (16%) and a just over one in five residents in poverty in Carver County (23%) have a disability.

#### Transportation to work

The majority of residents in all geographic areas who are employed drive to work, and do not carpool (63% in Carver County, 67% in Dakota County, 71% in Scott County).

# Crime rates and barriers associated criminal backgrounds

### Crime rates

Overall, Dakota County has higher crime rates, Scott County is in the middle, and Carver County has the lowest crime rates in the geographic region. For serious crimes (referring to crimes for which the penalty is incarceration for a year or longer), the crime rate per 100,000 residents is 2,281 in Dakota County, 1,814 in Scott County, and 1,110 in Carver County. Property crime rates are slightly lower but follow a pattern similar to serious crime (2,145 in Dakota; 1,718 in Scott County; 1,049 in Carver County). Violent crime rates per 100,000 residents are substantially lower: 137 in Dakota County, 96 in Scott County, and 62 in Carver County. It should be noted that the "serious crime rate" includes the property crime rate and the violent crime rate.

## Housing

In each county about one-third of all households are paying 30 percent or more of their income for housing (29% of all households in Scott County, 30% percent in Carver County, and 30% percent in Dakota County). **Nearly three-quarters of low-income households are paying 30% or more of their income for housing** (73% in Scott County, 71% in Carver County, and 79% in Dakota County).

**There is a 4 percent vacancy rate in each county.** Vacancy rates for units where rent is less than \$600 is 3 percent in Dakota County, 12 percent in Carver County, and 30 percent in Scott County.

## **Summary and next steps**

From our analysis of secondary data regarding residents in poverty in Carver County, Dakota County, and Scott County, we are able to provide some insight into the characteristics of residents in poverty in each of these geographic areas (and in comparison to the overall population, when applicable). The next step is to confirm these findings as meaningful for the 2015 CAP-SCD needs assessment, and then triangulate these data with the findings from other research tasks (e.g., client survey, field scan) during analysis and reporting. Please see the accompanying Excel spreadsheets for the raw data that contributed to this memo as well as other data that we identified as part of our review of secondary data.
