

Speaking for Ourselves: A Study with Immigrant and Refugee Communities in the Twin Cities -- Data Book

Detailed Results from the 2014
Speaking for Ourselves Community Survey

An initiative of the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation and conducted by Wilder Research

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The advisory board is made up of Wilder Foundation project staff, representatives from immigrant and refugee communities, and nonprofit organizations who serve these communities.

The advisory board provided direction on study methods, key questions, dissemination of the results, and key action steps.

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Introduction

Speaking for Ourselves engaged immigrants and refugees as well as the adult U.S.-born children of immigrants and refugees living in Hennepin and Ramsey counties. The study explores these communities' experiences with and perceptions about education, transportation, housing, safety, employment, finances, community and social engagement, and the immigrant experience in the Twin Cities. This study updates and builds on a previous study of immigrants and refugees conducted by Wilder Research in 2000 (Speaking for Themselves, A survey of Hispanic, Russian, and Somali immigrants in Minneapolis-Saint Paul).

The cultural communities that were selected to be included in this study was based on overall population sizes, communities Wilder Foundation and our partners serve, and the recommendations of project stakeholders in the community. We initially started with nine communities. Ultimately, we were able to collect enough data from five cultural communities – Hmong, Karen, Latino, Liberian, and Somali – to be able to present results back for these communities separately. *Speaking for Ourselves* also reports overall results combined from all of the study participants, which also includes a handful of people who are from other cultural communities: Vietnamese, Oromo, and Lao (the Cambodian/Khmer community was originally included in the planning of the study, but was dropped prior to data collection because we were unable to hire staff fluent in spoken and written Khmer).

We used an innovative data collection approach called Respondent Driven Sampling. This method uses a more culturally appropriate and logistically feasible approach to identifying study participants from within these cultural communities – it relies on participant referrals rather than random sampling and "cold calling" people without any prior relationship.

The results of and recommendations from *Speaking for Ourselves* will be shared with the communities who are directly affected by the study findings, as well as service providers, government agencies, policymakers, funders, and community members.

The purpose of *Speaking for Ourselves* is to:

- Improve services
- Direct resources to areas of unmet need
- Affect public policy
- Help communities and community-based organizations advocate on their own behalf

Methods

Survey instrument

The survey instrument was designed by Wilder Research in collaboration with the *Speaking for Ourselves* advisory board, Wilder Foundation staff, and our Buy-A-Question partners. After the final survey was developed in English, it was translated into other languages. The survey instrument was conducted in-person or over the phone in the following languages: English, Hmong, Karen, Lao, Oromo, Somali, Spanish, and Vietnamese. Please see the Appendix for the complete English version of the survey instrument.

Sample and data collection protocol

Study eligibility included the following criteria:

- Be a member of one of the cultural communities included in the study
- Born outside the United States or have at least one parent born outside the United States
- 18 years or older
- Live in Hennepin or Ramsey County¹

The study used Respondent-Driven Sampling (RDS), a sampling method used to identify hard-to-reach populations – in this case, immigrants and refugees who live in broader geographic communities. The method assumes the people who have the best access to members of hard-to-reach populations are their own peers. Through peer referral and structured cash incentives for completion of the survey and for making referrals, RDS uses a chain referral system to build the sample size and approach a representative sample of the population.

Some *Speaking for Ourselves* participants live outside of Hennepin County or Ramsey County (they initially self-identified or were identified by their referrer as being from Hennepin County or Ramsey County, but at the end of the interview provided addresses which are located in other Minnesota counties).

First, obtaining "seed respondents" is critical for the RDS methodology. For the *Speaking for Ourselves* data collection protocol, census tracts with high and medium density cultural communities included in the study were identified and canvassed to identify seed respondents. The following census tracts were included:

Approximately 5-10 seed interviews total were completed per cultural community. Seed respondents were chosen randomly, more or less, using the following guidelines:

- For each cultural community, at least one seed should fit each of the following criteria:
 - A woman age 39 and under
 - A man age 39 and under
 - A woman age 40 and over
 - A man age 40 and over

Survey interviewers identified initial seed respondents who reflected the gender, age, and geographic diversity of the cultural community or communities included in the study using the following approach. Interviewers canvassed census tracts, starting in the northwest corner of every (residential) block, traveling clockwise around each block and each tract, knocking on every other door. (If the interviewer was familiar with the area and was able to begin in a part of the census tract, such as a specific apartment complex or neighborhood which was known to have a high concentration of the target cultural community or communities, this was permitted in the data collection protocol.) Interviewers documented their canvassing efforts so as not to duplicate work and ensure accountability.

If at any point during their canvassing efforts, an interviewer came across a person in the neighborhood (not necessarily at the target addresses, but instead walking on the street, at a bus stop, etc.) who may meet the study criteria, they were permitted to approach the person and ask them screening questions to determine their eligibility. If interviewers knocked on at least 100 doors in the residential area/specific census tract grouping and were unable to find eligible seed respondents who meet the criteria, they were permitted to try to identify respondents in public places within the same census tract and approach people to screen them for eligibility.

Each seed respondent who completed the survey was invited to refer up to three people ("referrals") from their cultural community. Referrals must fulfill eligibility criteria required for all study participants and, in addition, referrals must not be a biological family member and must not live at the respondent's address.

After completing the interview with a respondent, Wilder interviewers were instructed to immediately ask the respondent if they would be willing to refer anyone meeting the criteria to participate. When possible, those individuals who were referred by the respondent were contacted by phone at that time to see if they would be willing to participate and if so, their contact information was obtained and/or an appointment was scheduled. In cases when it was not possible to contact intended referrals immediately, respondents were given referral cards that they could use to give to their intended referrals to contact us. These cards included unique identification numbers, and we tracked which respondents' referrals followed up. Interviewers called respondents whose referrals never contacted us or if a referral was not eligible for the study, to ask if we could identify alternative referrals to try to maintain the RDS chains. Each referral who completed the survey was then invited to refer up to three additional people from their cultural community, following a similar approach.

In theory and RDS best-practice, this pattern is repeated until the chain/social network is exhausted, and at least for eight waves. In reality, we had to let some chains drop, due to budget and time constraints.

Respondent incentives included a \$20 gift card for completing the survey and a \$5 gift card per referral (up to three referrals). Therefore, each respondent earned a maximum of \$35. Contact information for respondents was collected at the completion of the interview so we could mail out the incentives and to inform interested respondents of study findings and action steps.

Referral respondents who completed the study created "chains"; each new link in the "chain" created a "wave". Researchers tracked respondents' referral chains by assigning a confidential identification number to each individual. Referral chains were tracked using detailed spreadsheets, which documented respondent seeds, chains, and waves.

^a In addition to the five main cultural communities listed in the table – Hmong, Karen, Latino, Liberian, and Somali -- the "all respondents" group also includes 6 Lao, 7 Oromo, and 10 Vietnamese respondents. We did not obtain enough completed surveys from members of these cultural communities to be able to report data for these communities separately.

Interviewers communicated about study purpose with community members through flyers (in English as well as the cultural communities' languages). A sheet of culturally-based community resources was also available to interested respondents. Please refer to the Appendix for these documents.

Data collection was completed between November 2013 and June 2014.

Data cleaning and analysis

All completed surveys were checked by project staff for quality control and field verification. Any missing information, skipped questions, or other insufficient data was reviewed with the interviewer. When possible, the interviewer called the respondent back to obtain any missing data. Monitoring was completed for up to 5 percent of all phone interviews. Supervisors met with interviewers to review results of live monitoring sessions and provide feedback for ongoing quality improvement purposes. Whenever possible, someone who spoke the same language as the respondent participated in the monitoring session. Verification telephone calls with the respondent were completed with up to 10 percent of all complete face to face surveys to verify the survey was completed and to ensure consistency in data collection quality and good relationship-building with the community members who we interacted with during the course of the study.

Coding was completed to categorize responses to the open-ended questions into common themes. Please see the Appendix for the codebook.

The Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) was used to check and analyze the data and produce the data tables in the following sections of this data book. The survey data were analyzed by subgroups of respondents. (This analysis by respondent subgroup is described in more detail in the "how to use this data book" section starting on page 9).

Strengths and limitations of the RDS methodology

Strengths of the RDS methodology include how the approach extended our reach – the perspectives of many people from "hard to reach" immigrant and refugee communities are included in the *Speaking for Ourselves* study, many of which would not be included using a convenience sampling approach.

RDS sampling is also more culturally responsive than "cold calling" methods (randomly calling or knocking on doors for the entire study instead of just to identify the initial seed respondents like we did here), and worked well in most of the cultural communities included in this study. In other words, it seemed that most respondents were able to understand the request for referrals and in many cases follow-though on making them, and that referred community members were willing to take their friends up on the referral and actually complete the survey with a Wilder staff member. Although this method was quite expensive to implement, the alternative of pure random sampling would have been even more costly and time consuming (like "finding a needle in a haystack").

Speaking for Ourselves is, therefore, some of the best available data about immigrant and refugee communities in the Twin Cities on a range of topics. The RDS methodology used here produced a data set that falls somewhere between a pure convenience sampling (which is seen as invalid and biased in the social science research world) and scientific random sampling (which is not viewed as culturally appropriate in many immigrant communities and would have been logistically infeasible to implement). In practice, the data produced by this study approaches a representative sample of the cultural communities included in the study in some cases, although it should not be interpreted as a statistically representative sample.

As noted above, we were unable to fully exhaust the RDS sampling method in any of the cultural communities included in the study. Four communities were dropped from the study nearly at the beginning of data collection efforts, mainly because hiring and retaining bilingual (and literate in both languages) staff who had enough available hours, was not feasible. The RDS sampling method was, then, partially implemented. The RDS weighting/ analysis method was not implemented because it was not deemed appropriate for the study after careful review of the data. RDS weighting/analysis was not applied to the data for the following reasons:

Recommended sample sizes per community (150-200) are not met. Our largest set of completes is 105 completed surveys (Hmong community) and our smallest set of completes is 60 completed surveys (Liberian community).

- Because we stopped data collection before some referral chains were able to reach their natural conclusion, the data is incomplete. Chain length and chain to which a respondent belongs are important factors in the weighting process.
- Social network size reported by respondents is suspect. The range of values given varies from answers of two people up to more than 3,000. Network size is a very important factor in the weighting process. Depending on the distribution of the answers on a question, network size can make a big difference in a case's weight, and therefore the weighted results varied widely from unweighted results when we tested this analysis approach.

Culturally competent interpretation of study results

Nuanced understanding and responsible interpretation of the study results require a strong emphasis on the following:

First and foremost, each cultural community has distinct cultural practices and individuals within each cultural community may interpret survey questions differently. For example, survey best practices tell us that members of Latino communities are more likely to select extreme response categories (e.g. "Poor" or "Excellent" instead of "Only Fair") whereas members of Asian communities are more likely to select more moderate response categories (e.g. "Sometimes" instead of "Always" or "Never" 2). This has a major impact on study results. It is then often inappropriate to compare responses between cultural communities. We recommend that aggregated responses from each cultural community is interpreted without comparison and with the consideration of the unique historical, social, and economic context in which each community is grounded within.

Recognize the difference between perception data and incidence data. The *Speaking for Ourselves* study mainly focuses on self-reported perceptions of respondents from immigrant and refugee communities and does not provide representative incidence data. For example, the survey may ask about the perception about biggest health challenges within each community – participants' responses reflect their perceptions of issues in their communities, not the actual incidence of any specific health condition. When possible, pairing perception data with available incidence data allows for a better picture of immigrant and refugee communities. (And if there is a gap between perception data and incidence data, this does not necessarily mean the perception data is invalid. People from within immigrant and refugee communities and/or who work with immigrant and refugee communities often have good insight about these differences.)

Know how social desirability bias impacts respondents, especially respondents from immigrant and refugee communities. Social desirability bias describes the tendency of survey respondents to answer questions in a way that will be viewed positively (i.e., they want to provide the "right" answer). This is something that impacts all types of survey research and, to an extent, all people-centered research. Because immigrant and refugee communities may be smaller and the questions may broach subjects that are sensitive, interpretation of findings must take social desirability bias into account.

Finally, this data is best interpreted with the acknowledgment that the answers are what respondents from these immigrant and refugee communities felt comfortable sharing with Wilder Research in the context of this study. The *Speaking for Ourselves* data do not

represent the "truth" to any greater degree than the communities who participated in the research believe and stand behind the findings and recommendations.

Therefore, the data must be used alongside work with immigrant and refugee communities and NOT in replacement of authentic relationship building with active and respected members and organizations who are a part of and serve immigrant and refugee communities. In other words, do not over-reach the appropriate uses of these data (i.e., do not use *Speaking for Ourselves* data, or any one data source, as your only source of information about immigrant and refugee communities when making decisions about policies or programs). Instead, we recommend working alongside or in support of immigrant and refugee communities to achieve the goals and vision they set for themselves.

Talking points about the study methods

To support stakeholders in communicating about the results of the study, the following "talking points" can be used to help explain the study methods:

Who is eligible for the study?

All study respondents must be:

- Part of a cultural community included in the study
- Born outside the U.S. or have at least one parent born outside the U.S.
- 18 years of age or older
- Live in Hennepin or Ramsey county

How did we find respondents for the study?

The study used Respondent Driven Sampling, which relies on social networks to make referrals. We conducted canvassing and door knocking to gather "seeds" (which are the first 5-10 respondents from each cultural community). Seeds vary by location, gender, and age. Respondents invited up to three "referrals" to complete the interview.

Referrals must **not**:

- Be a biological family member
- Live in the respondents' household

Referrals who completed the interview created "chains". Each "chain" creates a "wave".

What did we give people for participating in the study?

Respondent incentives included a \$20 gift card for completing the interview and a \$5 gift card for each referral. Respondents were asked for their contact information if they were interested in receiving findings from the study and if they were interested in participating in next action steps following the release of the study results.

What are limitations of the study?

Respondent Driven Sampling is extremely expensive and labor intensive. We were not able to fully exhaust the sampling method in any community. Four communities were dropped

from the study, due to staffing limitations (we were unable to hire and retain bilingual staff who could put in enough hours). Therefore, data are not statistically representative of the population.

What are strengths of the study?

- Respondent Driven Sampling is more culturally responsive than "cold calling" methods and worked well in some communities
- This approach extended our reach the perspectives of many people from these "hard to find" immigrant and refugee communities are included.
- Findings fall somewhere in the middle range of the research spectrum from pure convenience sampling (biased, invalid) to scientific random sampling (inappropriate in many immigrant and refugee communities). The group of respondents we interviewed, in practice, approaches a representative sample of their communities.
- This is the best available data about immigrant and refugee perspectives in the Twin Cities on a range of topics.

What are some of the most important issues to remember to communicate the study results in a culturally competent way?

- Because each cultural community is unique, any and all comparisons made between or across communities should consider the unique historical, social, and economic contexts of these communities.
- Recognize the difference between perception data and incidence data. The *Speaking for Ourselves* study mainly focuses on perceptions of respondents from immigrant and refugee communities; this study does not provide representative incidence data.
- Because immigrant and refugee communities are smaller and close-knit (including the interviewers who worked on this study), and the questions may broach subjects that are sensitive, interpretation of findings must take social desirability bias into account.
- In order to ensure positive impact, data from *Speaking for Ourselves* should be used in conjunction with other data sources. Any policy or programming decisions should be made only in collaboration or partnership with affected immigrant and refugee communities.

How to use this data book

For every table in this data book, results are displayed for subgroups of respondents in the rows of the table by:

- All respondents, including all five main cultural communities plus 23 respondents from three other communities Lao, Oromo, and Vietnamese
- Cultural community: Hmong, Karen, Latino, Liberian, and Somali
- Generational status: 1st born outside of the U.S., and 2nd born in the U.S. (but at least one parent born outside of the U.S.)
- Age: 18-29, 30-49, 50+
- Education: no formal education, some schooling without a diploma or GED, high school diploma or GED, some college or Associates (AA) degree, bachelor's degree or higher
- Household income: less than \$10,000; \$10,000 to \$19,999; \$20,000 to \$29,999; \$30,000 to \$49,999; \$50,000 or more
- County of residence: Hennepin County, Ramsey County, and other county in Minnesota

The columns in each table correspond to the response option that respondents were given on the survey (see Appendix for the survey instrument). Each column in the tables indicates the percentage of respondents who gave that response to the question. Some answer categories are combined because of the low number of responses in those categories. The last column in each row of the table shows the number of people related to the percentages in that row. Some questions apply only to certain types of respondents (due to skip patterns in the survey). Data were suppressed when row sizes were fewer than 10 respondents to protect participant confidentiality.

Some questions were open-ended, such that respondents wrote their own answers. These responses were translated by the interviewer to English as they recorded the interview. For the attached tables, the responses to each question were coded (grouped) according to theme in order to reveal which trends are most notable. In some cases, respondents were allowed to provide more than one answer. When fewer than 10 respondents submitted an answer fitting a particular theme or category, that theme is grouped with answers in an "Other" category.

Survey results

Close-ended responses

Speaking for Ourselves Databook Demographics

The survey results reported in the first several rows of the tables below represent the communities for which we were able to get enough completed surveys to analyze them within their individual cultural community. The data in the remaining rows of the table include the data from the Hmong, Karen, Latino, Liberian, and Somali communities, as well as data from 6 Lao, 7 Oromo, and 10 Vietnamese respondents who completed the survey. We were not able to analyze the data from these respondents within their individual cultural communities due to the small number of respondents.

In addition, any row with an N of < 10 has been censored out of concerns for respondents' confidentiality.

Data sharing policy

Speaking for Ourselves: A study of communities of immigrants and refugees in the Twin Cities

Commissioned by the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation Revised: 4/11/2013

This document establishes the principles of data sharing and ownership that will be applied to the data generated by *Speaking for Ourselves – A Study of immigrants and refugees in the Twin Cities* ("the Study"). The aim of this policy is to outline clear guidelines and expectations for the sharing and use of data generated from the Study, as well as guidelines for dissemination and publication of the Study results, including publication authorship and acknowledgement.

This document describes in greater detail how we will handle three types of information:

Information that identifies specific people who participated in the Study	This information will never be shared except as required by law.
A data file – <i>without names or</i> addresses – which someone can use for their own research	The policy makes this information available to organizations serving immigrant communities, to students from immigrant communities, and to others who want to raise awareness about immigrant communities.
Summary tables and charts	Wilder Research will produce and distribute these and make them available to the general public on the Study's website. Others are also allowed to distribute these, with a reference to the source of the information.

Data security – Individual-level data

The individual data that is gathered and compiled as a part of the Study will be stored and protected by the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation (Wilder Research). The data will be stored electronically on Wilder Research's secure servers and in locked paper files, as required by data privacy laws. Only Wilder Research staff who are working on the Study will have access to individual data. Individual level data will never be shared with any individual or organization or any division of Wilder Foundation outside of Wilder Research, except as required by law.

Data use – De-identified data files

This section establishes proper and improper use of the de-identified data files that will be generated from the Study. It is impossible to anticipate or create a policy or rule a priori for every possible data sharing request that may arise. Therefore, the following examples are intended to provide general guidelines for data sharing that can be used by Wilder Research to ensure proper use of their data now and in the future.

During the course of the Study, the Advisory Board will be asked to provide feedback regarding how to respond to specific data requests that arise. After the Study is completed and the Advisory Board is no longer a functioning group, all specific data requests will be vetted by a subset of members of the Wilder Research Cultural Research Partnership Council (CRPC). If a request is made that is outside the criteria established here, then the CRPC will decide to approve or deny the request based on their best judgment of intent and impact of data use. If the CRPC is not in operation or has dissolved, then appointed staff of Wilder Research will make decisions about data use.

The following are examples of external requests that are likely to be accepted:

- Nonprofit or community-based organization that wants to improve service access, delivery, and/or outcomes for one or more of the nine immigrant communities
- Individual or community organization that wants to use the data to advocate for a cause that is likely to benefit one or more of the nine immigrant communities
- Advocates, media, and others who want to include the data in media stories or public venues to increase awareness about the important issues in the nine immigrant communities
- Students from the immigrant communities who want to do research about their community

The following are examples of external requests that may or may not be accepted depending on the specific situation:

- Students, professors, or other professional researchers who want to use the data for their own research purposes that might include peer-reviewed publications, comparison to other areas of the country or other data sets, etc. for the purposes of increasing knowledge or understanding in the academic community
- Individuals or organizations who want to use the data to advocate for policies, programs, etc. where the direct benefit to the community is unclear or in question

The following are examples of external requests for data that are very likely to NOT be accepted:

- Individuals or organizations who intend to use the data to create a negative impact for one or more of the target communities. This includes a vetting of the end users of data to understand their track record in the community.
- Market research by for-profit companies

If the data file is approved for sharing with an organization or entity outside of the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation, all identifying individual information such as name, address, and phone number will be removed from the data file. We will follow the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) protocol for variables that must be suppressed. In addition, we may also exclude or suppress other items if we determine that there is a reasonable chance that someone could use those items to identify specific individual(s).

Once data and results are available, Wilder Research is committed to documenting the representativeness of the data for each community of immigrants. Wilder Research will share this documentation with anyone using the data in order to ensure that each community is accurately represented.

Dissemination and publication – Summary data tables and reports

Dissemination and publication of results from the Study is considered to be both an opportunity and responsibility. Authorship and acknowledgement guidelines for the Study are outlined below.

Wilder Research will produce at minimum:

- A full report of the findings.
- Summary reports and data books about each of the nine communities of immigrants.

- Other reports that are in the interest of the Speaking for Ourselves Advisory Board.
- Other reports that are in the interest of the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation and of interest to Wilder Research Study staff.

Involvement of individuals in particular products will be recognized based on their participation in the work directly supporting the products. (For example, a Wilder staff member or Advisory Board member would not be listed as an author of a paper unless they contributed to the preparation of that paper.)

- All Advisory Board members, independent contractors, and project staff will be acknowledged in the full version of the Study report by having their name listed.
- Advisory Board members, independent contractors, and project staff may also be acknowledged in other Study reports. The decision to acknowledge is the Author's and will be based on direct contributions to that product.
- All survey participants will be acknowledged as "study participants" and their individual names and identities will never be revealed.

Intended use of Study data and results by Amherst H. Wilder Foundation

The Amherst H. Wilder Foundation intends to use the data and results from this Study to advance the livelihoods of the communities of immigrants identified in this Study. This could include: informing and improving service delivery of Wilder Programs; being a convener for public policy and advocacy through Wilder Center for Communities; among other potential organizational activities. This stated intention is contingent upon interest of stakeholders from organizations or members from within the Study's communities of immigrants and availability of funding.

Amending the policy

Amendments can be made to the Policy if approved by 2/3 vote of the CRPC. If the CRPC is not in operation or has dissolved, then the Study staff or Executive Director of Wilder Research have the right to amend the Policy as needed to ensure the ongoing protection and appropriate use of the Study data.

Approval and commitment

On April 16, 2013, the Speaking for Ourselves Advisory Board reviewed this Policy, provided feedback on its contents, and approved its use. Wilder Research staff have committed to abiding by the Policy.
