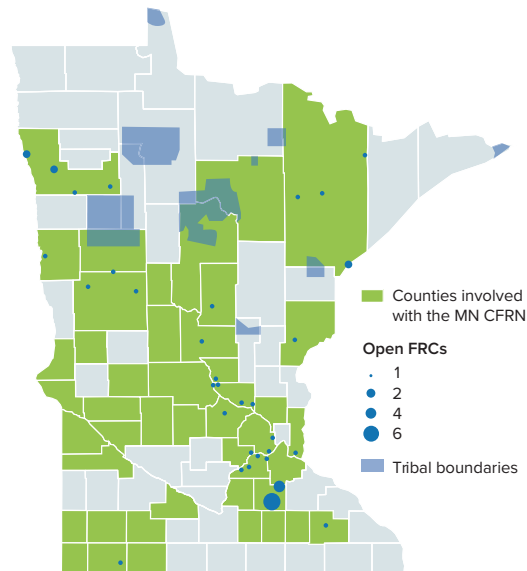
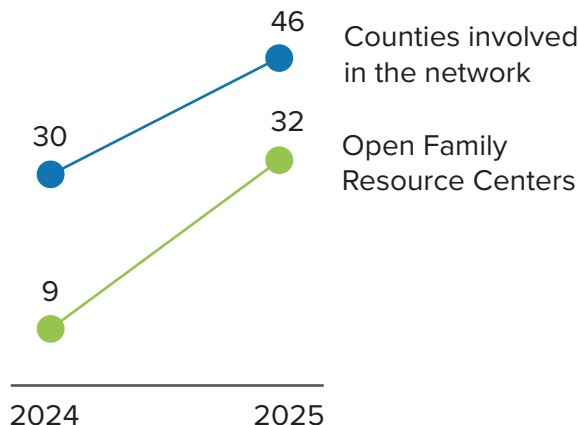


Minnesota Community & Family Resource Network

The Minnesota Community & Family Resource Network (MN CFRN) works to improve the health, safety, and well-being of children and families across Minnesota through Family Resource Centers. Family Resource Centers are a welcoming, community- or school-based hub where families can find support, services, and opportunities to grow together. The MN CFRN helps counties develop, launch, and implement Family Resource Centers that are rooted in community needs and shaped through collaboration between local partners and government agencies.

The Network is growing and reaching families across Minnesota:



In 2025:

- 9,343 households
- 11,773 adults
- 11,301 children ages 6-17
- 2,343 children ages 0-5

were served by Family Resource Centers across Minnesota¹

¹ This is a duplicated count, so individuals and households who engaged with the FRC multiple times would be counted each time they were served.
