
Overview of Managed Care Organization Services for Youth with Autism

The following provides information on diagnostic assessments and services provided to youth aged 0-6 with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) by managed care organizations (MCOs). DHS contracts with MCOs to provide health care services for Minnesota Health Care Program (MHCP) members. The ASD services are covered under the Families and Children contract, which includes Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare.



Small sample sizes may be due to small enrollment in those service areas.

* Medica does not have a Families and Children contract with DHS.


