


Data Book for Southwest Health and Human Services

2015 Southwest/South Central MN Adult Health Survey

OCTOBER 2015

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Introduction and methods

Staff from the public health agencies representing Big Stone, Chippewa, Cottonwood, Jackson, Kandiyohi, Lac qui Parle, Lincoln, Lyon, Murray, Nobles, Pipestone, Redwood, Renville, Rock, Swift, and Yellow Medicine counties developed the survey instrument with technical assistance from the Minnesota Department of Health Center for Health Statistics. Existing items from the Behavior Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) survey and from other recent surveys in Minnesota were used to design some of the items on the survey instrument. The survey was formatted by the printing and mailing vendor, Survey Systems, Inc., of New Brighton, MN, as a scannable, self-administered English-language questionnaire. See the Appendix for the survey instrument.

Sample

A two-stage sampling strategy was used for obtaining a statistically representative sample of adults living in each of the 16 counties. A separate sample was drawn for each county. For the first stage of sampling, a random sample of county residential addresses was purchased from a national sampling vendor (Marketing Systems Group of Horsham, PA). Address-based sampling was used so that all households would have an equal chance of being sampled for the survey, regardless of their phone status (cell-only, multiple lines, etc.) Marketing Systems Group obtained the list of addresses from the U.S. Postal Service.

For the second stage of sampling, the “most recent birthday” method of within-household respondent selection was used to specify one adult from each selected household to complete the survey. The purpose of within household randomization is to ensure a better gender and age balance among the survey respondents.

Data collection

An initial survey packet that included a cover letter, the survey instrument, and a postage-paid return envelope was mailed April 27-30, 2015, to 20,100 sampled households (1,200 for 13 of the counties and 1,500 for three of the counties). Approximately two weeks after the first survey packets were mailed (May 8), a postcard was sent to all sampled households, reminding those who had not yet returned a survey to do so, and thanking those who had already responded. Two weeks after the reminder postcards were mailed (May 22), another full survey packet was sent to all households that still had not returned the survey. The remaining completed surveys were received over the next eight weeks, with the final date for the receipt of surveys being July 31, 2015.

Completed surveys

Completed surveys were received from 6,125 adult residents of the 16 counties; thus, the overall response rate was 30.5% (6,125/20,100). County-specific population, sample, and response rates can be found in Figure 1.

Data cleaning and analysis

The responses from the completed surveys were scanned into an electronic file by Survey Systems, Inc. The scanned data were transferred to Minnesota Department of Health Center for Health Statistics staff for verification, cleaning and new variable creation.

To ensure that the survey results are representative of the adult population of each of the 16 counties, the data were weighted by the Minnesota Department of Health's Center for Health Statistics staff. The weighting accounts for the sample design by adjusting for the number of adults living in each sampled household. The weighting also includes a post-stratification adjustment so that the gender and age distribution of the survey respondents mirrors the gender and age distribution of the adult populations of the 12 counties, according to U.S. Census Bureau 2010 estimates.

How to use this data book

The “area of focus” for this data book is the counties served by **Southwest Health and Human Services** – Lincoln, Lyon, Murray, Pipestone, Redwood, and Rock counties. Data books using this same format have been developed for each of the 16 reporting areas, as shown in Figure 1. Please see the other data books in this series for more detailed information about these other areas. For every table in this data book, results are displayed for sub-groups of respondents from the region served by Southwest Health and Human Services based on:

- Gender
- Age, including adults ages 18-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65-74, and 75+
- Highest level of education including less than high school diploma/GED, high school diploma/GED, some college, trade school, or Associate degree, and bachelor's degree or higher
- Annual household income ranges including less than \$20,000, \$20,000-\$34,999, \$35,000-\$49,999, \$50,000-\$74,999, \$75,000 or more.

The columns in each table correspond to the response options respondents were given on the survey (see Appendix for survey instrument). If a table represents a survey question with fixed response categories, each column indicated the percentage of respondents who gave that response to the question. Some answer categories are combined because of the low number of responses in those categories. The last column in each row of the table always presents the number of people (unweighted) related to the percentages in that row. Some questions may apply only to certain types of respondents (due to skip patterns in the survey). In these cases, the percentages were calculated based on the number of respondents who were asked that question (as shown by the unweighted Ns in the last column).
