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This packet provides an overview of the major social, educational, economic and housing characteristics of the Saint Paul Promise Neighborhood. This is one of several exhibits prepared to assist the Saint Paul Promise Neighborhood Solution Action Groups. Additional data about the neighborhood will be distributed in April when results from the Promise Neighborhood Community Assessment Survey become available.

The packet is organized as follows:

- The body of the packet shows summary graphs and data tables. It contains the following sections: Demographics, Education, Employment and Income, and Housing and Transportation
- Appendix A contains additional detailed data tables.
- Appendix B lists indicators that will be provided in the future.

The data in this packet come from the American Community Survey, the Center for Urban and Regional Affairs (CURA) at the University of Minnesota, and the St. Paul Public Schools.

The American Community Survey (ACS) is an on-going survey conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. The numbers from the ACS represent the average characteristics of the St. Paul Promise Neighborhood between January 2005 and December 2009; the period during which residents of the neighborhood were surveyed. Because the numbers come from a representative survey rather than a complete count of neighborhood residents, the true numbers could be higher or lower than the numbers shown in the tables.

The St. Paul Public Schools collects information about each of the students in the school district. The numbers in this packet with the notation, “Source: St. Paul Public Schools” represent a complete count of all the St. Paul Public School students living in the neighborhood in the fall of 2009; they do not include students who moved into the neighborhood after that time or students who attend schools other than St. Paul Public Schools.





Promise Neighborhood students in St. Paul Public Schools

















The poverty threshold for families and individuals of a family of this size and composition will vary slightly depending on the month in which the family member was interviewed.



Housing occupancy



Housing tenure (owner/renter status)



Housing mobility (Residence 1 year ago)





Year householder moved into unit





Cost-burdened households




