

Detailed Results from the 2018 Anoka County Adult Health Survey

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Introduction and methods

In summer 2018, Wilder Research was contracted to conduct a survey of adults in Anoka County to learn more about their health status, health behaviors, and health-related concerns for their community. Anoka County Public Health and Environmental Services advised Wilder Research on the development of the survey instrument and data collection methods. A similar survey was conducted in 2013, and that version of the survey was significantly modified for the 2018 survey. For this survey, Anoka County Public Health and Environmental Services partnered with Allina Health – Mercy Hospital to align the information collected and the timing of the survey with Allina Health – Mercy Hospital's triennial Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA).

Survey instrument

The survey instrument was designed by Anoka County Public Health and Environmental Services with assistance from Wilder Research. The survey instrument is 8 pages in length and included 54 closed-ended questions. A paper and web version of the survey were provided to participants. The web version was programmed in Acuity, a web survey platform. Participants were mailed a paper version of the survey and were also provided the option to take the survey in English or Spanish on the web. Participants were also given the option to call a number to request assistance with completing the survey in Hmong, Somali, or Spanish over the phone. Sample


Address-based sampling was used to ensure all households in Anoka County were included in the sampling frame regardless of their phone status. The sample was purchased from Marketing Systems Group. See Figure 1 for an illustration of the number of sampled addresses, number of completed surveys, response rate, and margin of error (both nominal and weighted). Data collection

Wilder Research used a "modified Dillman" method of survey mailing as follows: An initial survey packet that included a cover letter, the survey instrument, and a postage-paid return envelope was mailed on September 12, 2018, to 4,000 sampled households. Participants were invited to be entered into a drawing for one of five \$100 Target gift cards as an incentive.

Approximately one week after the first survey packets were mailed (September 19), a postcard was sent to all sampled households, reminding those who had not yet returned a survey to do so, and thanking those who had already responded.

On September 26, two weeks after the reminder postcards were mailed, another full survey packet was sent to all households that still had not returned the survey. The remaining completed surveys were received over the next 2-3 weeks, with the final date for the receipt of surveys being October 17, 2018. The targeted number of completed surveys was 500-800 for a response rate of 13-20 percent. The target number of completed surveys was exceeded with a total of 857 survey completes for a response rate of 21.8 percent.

Adults were randomly selected from within the sampled households using the "most recently birthday" method (asking the adult who most recently had a birthday to fill out the one survey for that household) to ensure gender and age balance in survey respondents.

Data cleaning

All completed surveys were tracked, proofed, and coded by trained Wilder staff. Paper survey data were entered into data analysis software by Wilder staff, and a 10 percent verification process was used to ensure accuracy of the data entry. Once the data entry was complete, Wilder's research analyst used SPSS to create an analyzable data file and performed quality tests.

Coding was completed to categorize responses to the open-ended questions. See the Appendix for the codebook.

Weighting and analysis

Survey data are weighted to produce reliable estimates of population parameters. Weighting also compensates for practical limitations of a sample survey, such as differential nonresponse and under-coverage. By taking advantage of demographic information about the target population, weighting can reduce the variability of survey estimates.

The weighting process entails three steps. The first step consists of the computation of *design* or *base weights* to reflect any differential selection based on number of adults in the sampled household. In the second step, base weights are adjusted so that the resulting weights can aggregate to reported totals for the target population. Finally, adjusted weights are put through a series of quality control checks to detect extreme outliers and to prevent any computational or procedural errors.

The data were weighted against the U.S. Census Bureau's 2017 Population Estimates. Given the sample size and the demographic composition of the adult population of Anoka County, design weights were adjusted by age and gender. Survey data for these demographic questions included missing values. All such missing values were first imputed using a hot-deck procedure before construction of the survey weights.

Talking points about the study methods

To assist the representatives from Anoka County in communicating with their stakeholders (including their Commissioners, Community Health Board, Allina Health – Mercy Hospital, other organizational leadership, the media, and the general public) about this study, the following "talking points" can be used to help explain the study methods:

- This is a mailed survey with a web option. Each sampled household received up to three mailings.
- The survey was sent to a random sample of households in Anoka County. All households had an equal chance of being sampled.
- The response rate for this survey was 21.8 percent and is better than expected for mailed surveys with a web option and with the incentive offered for participation.
- Respondents were entered into a drawing to win one of five \$100 Target gift cards.
- The survey data are adjusted with post-stratification and design weighting, which are statistical techniques commonly used to correct for nonresponse bias (whereby certain types of people are more or less likely to respond to surveys).
- These methods ultimately produced a sample that is statistically representative of the adult population in Anoka County.
- It is important to be aware of the limitations of the data. When looking at differences between white respondents and respondents of color, keep in mind that a higher percentage of survey respondents of color were age 18-44. The same is true for respondents living in households with children versus households without children. Differences between these demographic groups could be attributed to differences in the age distribution of respondents rather than race or household type.

How to use this data book

For every table in this data book, results are displayed for sub-groups of respondents from Anoka County based on:

- Gender, including male and female
- Age, including adults ages 18-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65-74, and 75+
- Race, including people of color and white
- Highest education obtained by the respondent, including high school graduate/GED or less, some college or AA degree, and bachelor's degree or higher
- Household poverty status, including 200% of the poverty line or less, and greater than 200% of the poverty line
- Household type, including single adults with no children, 2+ adults with no children, single adults with 1+ children, and 2+ adults with 1+ children

The columns in each table correspond to the response options respondents were given on the survey (see Appendix for the survey instrument). If a table presents a survey question with fixed response categories, each column indicates the percentage of respondents who gave that response to the question. Some answer categories are combined because of the low number of responses in those categories. The last column in each row of the table always presents the unweighted number of respondents. Some questions apply only to certain types of respondents (due to skip patterns in the survey). In these cases, the total includes only the respondents for whom the question was applicable.

Some table cells are filled with only a dash. This means that the number of respondents was too small and was therefore suppressed to protect confidentiality, and because the small numbers might not produce reliable population estimates.

Some questions were open-ended, such that respondents wrote their own answers. Responses were grouped according to theme in order to reveal which trends are most notable. In some cases, respondents were allowed to provide more than one answer; for this reason, the total number of responses listed in these tables does not correspond directly to the number of respondents, but rather to the number of answers for a question. The number of respondents can be seen in the title of each table ("N="). Where fewer than 10 respondents submitted an answer fitting a particular theme, that theme is grouped with other answers in an "Other" category.
